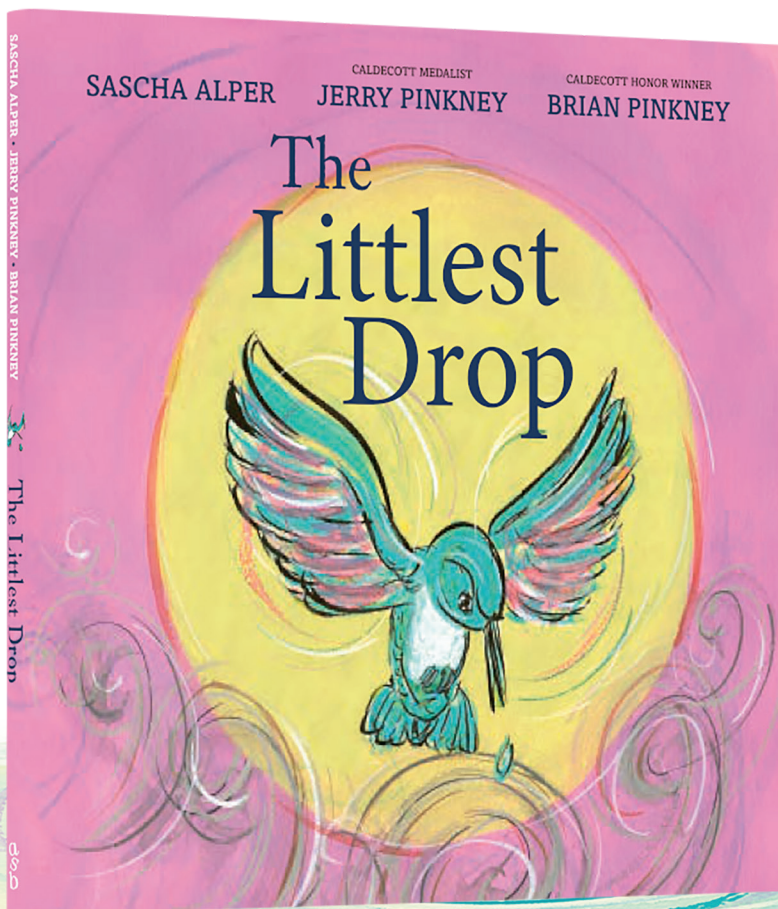

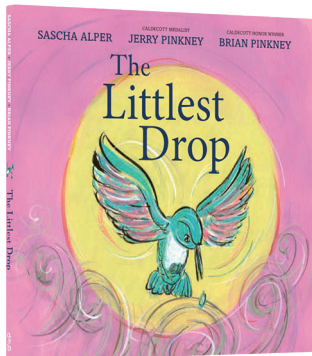
BEFORE STARTING THE STORY

How does the story of the tiny hummingbird illustrate the idea that even the smallest among us can make a significant impact in times of crisis?



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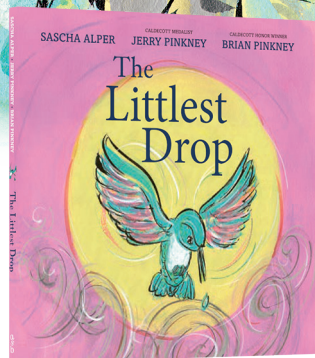
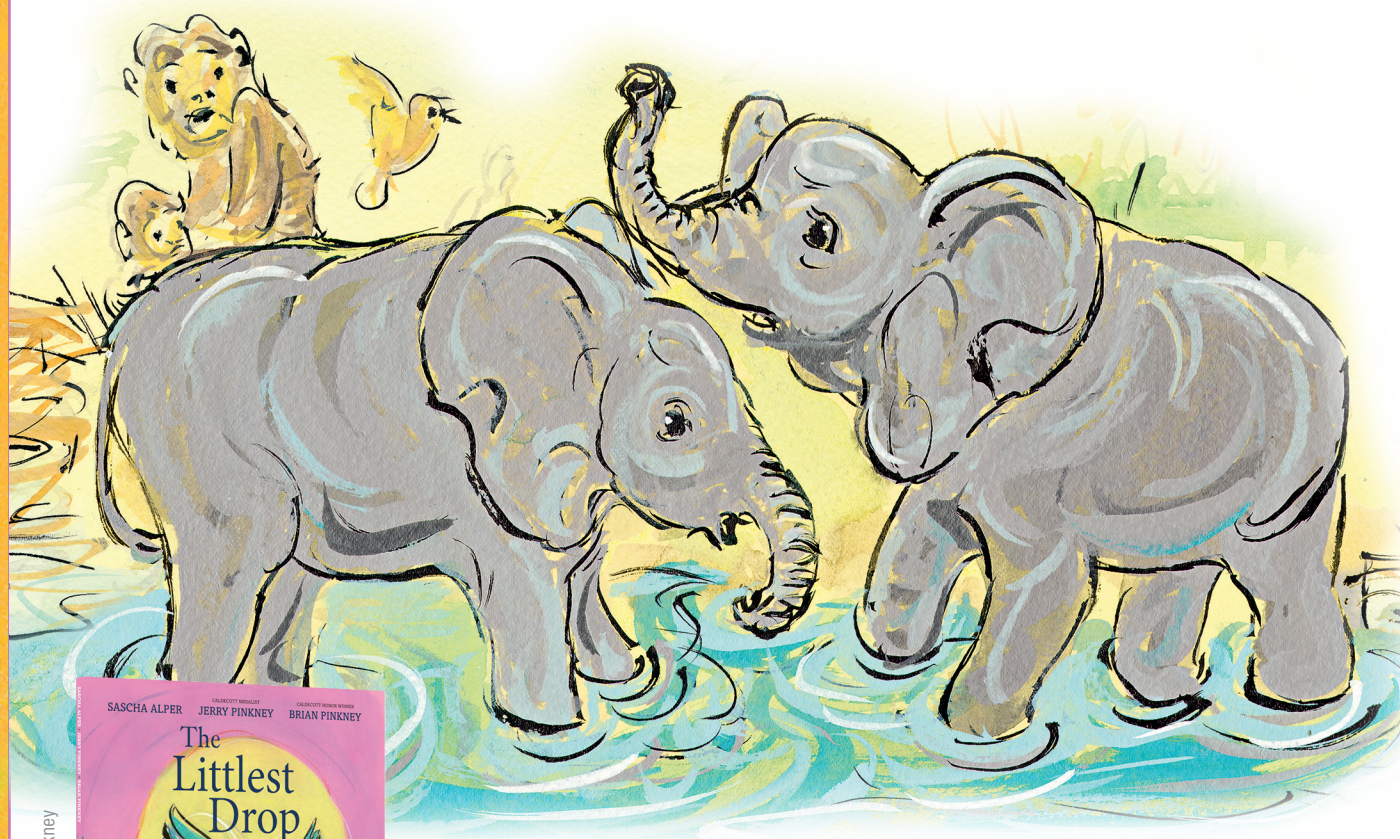
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Together We Grow Classroom Activity

For a craft activity inspired by the empowering themes of the picture book, gather colored paper, markers, scissors, glue, and natural materials like leaves or twigs.

Have the kids create a “Together We Grow” collage where they draw or cut out images of their favorite plants, animals, and people working together.

Encourage them to write or illustrate their ideas for making the world a better, greener place on the collage. Once finished, display the artwork in a prominent area to celebrate their creativity and collaboration!



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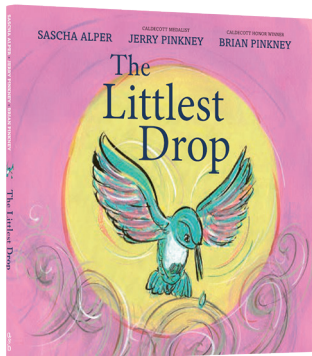
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Miniature Superhero

Ask kids to draw a superhero version of themselves and to write down their personal superpower—such as kindness, creativity, or determination—that represents the change they can contribute to the world in the box below. Once they've drawn their figures, allow them to share their superpowers with the group, reinforcing the message that everyone, no matter their size, can make a difference!



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
