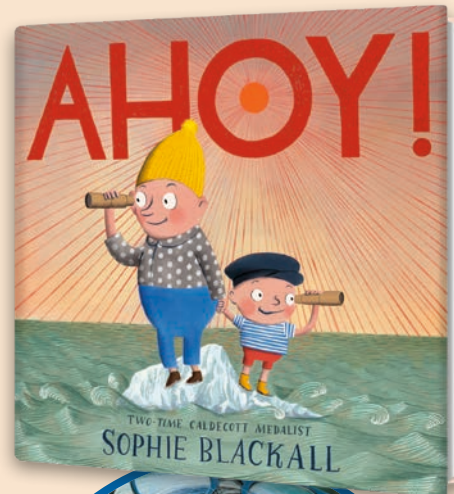


About the Book

Before Reading Predictions

In *Ahoy!* a parent and child set off on an imaginary nautical adventure. Before you start the story, show readers the cover image and case covering. Ask them to use their imagination to predict what will happen once the parent and child set sail.
