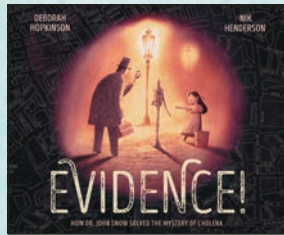

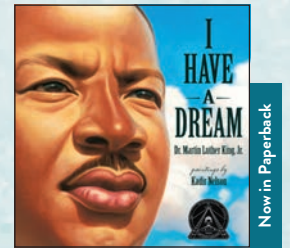

A stunning picture book about the five largest lakes in North America—how they formed, the importance of their abundant freshwater, and how they've become a national treasure.



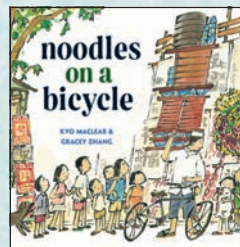

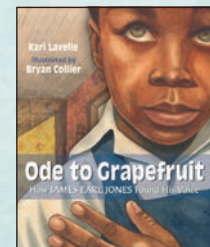

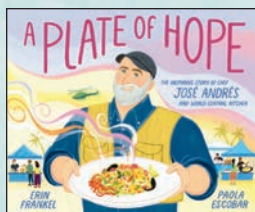


Noodles on a Bicycle

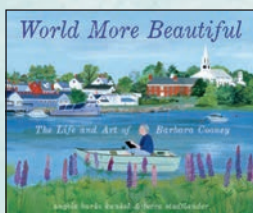
