
Born Ready: The True Story of a Boy Named Penelope – Lesson Prompt

Questions

- Penelope dreams of being a ninja. What is a ninja and what did ninjas do?
- Everyone thinks that Penelope is a girl and treats him like a girl. How does Penelope respond to this?
- When Penelope was born, the doctor or midwife said that he was a girl. Now that he is older, he can explain to people that he is a boy. What is a term we can use to describe people who are assigned boy/girl at birth and don't feel that way?
- How does Penelope let people know that he is a boy? Does he change some things about himself? Are there some things that he does not change?

Activities

- Learn more about ninjas; find out what country and culture they are from and what they really did
 in society. Draw pictures of what ninjas looked like and what they did.
- Learn more about martial arts and tell another person about two types of martial arts.
- Penelope was frustrated when people insisted that he was a girl, and this caused him to act out. Make a list of ways to calm down when you are frustrated or angry so you can communicate better with other people. How can you help someone who is frustrated?
